IBC Missions Update

The Bruce Family/Ethnos360

June 6, 2020: One year ago, none of us could have imagined that our world now. We are now in a world where everyone in the grocery store wears a mask, our social activity is incredibly limited, Americans are having to come to terms with its blatant imperfections in regards to racism and the mistreatment of our black community, and the global impact of Covid-19 is drastically affecting our co-laborers around the world as travel is extremely restricted. The list goes on. Sometimes things really do seem impossible. We pray that you are turning to Scripture during these uncertain times. I admit, sometimes I get sucked into opinions and beliefs that aren't biblical nor helpful. These are good times of growth and self-reflection as I remember that none of this is outside of God's control and my job is to seek Him first, above all else.

A week and a half ago, we were in Madagascar, asking the Lord for a way back to the USA. Our adoption completed, we had only to find a flight off the island, but things seemed impossible as the country was still in official lockdown, especially when it came to travel. The US Embassy, who had been monitoring repatriation flights and asking for seats for US citizens, miraculously were able to secure us a flight to Qatar. I had bouts of

emotions as I realized that I was saying goodbye to my son's birth country. While he will not remember it, it holds a special place in our hearts and we can't wait until we can return someday.

We have been in the states for just over a week now. Because of Covid-19, Ethnos360 has temporarily extended our home assignment to September 2020. For us specifically, we are simply waiting until our visa processing goes through. However, because of the current situation, government and immigration offices are closed and international AND domestic travel is banned. So while we had anticipated returning home sometime in early August after finishing up Rovan's medical and other paperwork, as well as introduce him to friends and family, it looks as though it may be longer than that. I miss our Asmat friends so much, but we also know that God's plans are higher than ours...

While we wait, God has provided in a way that we never thought possible. For many years now, we have been saving our finances in the hopes of possibly buying a house in the states that would serve as "home" and a small sense of stability for our kids whenever we return from the field for furloughs and in the future, for college, etc. while also being able to rent while we are overseas. We know of several missionary friends who have done this successfully. Through a realtor friend, a house in East Lansing, Michigan became available to us around the time we were headed over to Madagascar. With help from our amazing family and the graciousness of the seller to give us a great deal, we have bought the house! This has not gone without lots of thought and wisdom-seeking. So while we are in the states, and especially before we can meet with you in person, we will be spending our time working on this house and fixing it up to rent when we leave.

Tomorrow Rovan turns the big TWO!! I can't believe that we have only had him for 3-1/2 months. He has now begun talking, something I was worried about at the beginning. His personality is joyful and so relaxed. God knew he would need that to be in our family. ;) We have been so blessed by him and I still can't believe our adoption is complete and that we have THREE children. We can't wait for you to meet him.
