• My grandma got her knee brace off, and is doing well! Her wound is (mostly) healed, and she is mostly independent. We have been able to move back home, while also still spending lots of time with her now

that school is over. The current challenge is to keep her from trying to do everything all at once! Looking back, we have so CLEARLY seen God's hand in this. She broke her knee on April 13th, right in the height of the pandemic here in Hungary, and right when she was really getting antsy. This caused us to move in with her and keep her company. The broken knee kept her from the 40 stairs to get out.

- I was able to renew my teaching license with minimal issues after getting some tips from a friend who had recently been through the process.
- The school year has officially ended. Though we ended with the distance learning model, we were able to have an in-person graduation ceremony (for graduates and their parents), an in-person graduation party, and end-of-the-year picnic. Restrictions are easing up in Hungary, and we are feeling hopeful.

Our summer plans have also changed. We had planned on being in the U.S. this summer, but unfortunately international travel is a bit of a struggle right now. We've been praying a lot about how to use this summer for ministry. God has really laid discipleship on our hearts: Chris is meeting up with a group of senior boys, and I am going to be leading a middle school girls' Bible study in a park! I just sent out the information to MS parents and students, so please be praying for favorable responses, and for the Lord to be at work!
