2 Samuel 1:1 Now it came about after the death of Saul, when David had returned from the slaughter of the Amalekites, that David remained two days in Ziklag.

2 Samuel 1:2-3 And it happened on the third day, that behold, a man came out of the camp from Saul, with his clothes torn and dust on his head. And it came about when he came to David that he fell to the ground and prostrated himself. **3** Then David said to him, "From where do you come?" And he said to him, "I have escaped from the camp of Israel."

2 Samuel 1:4-10 And David said to him, "How did things go? Please tell me." And he said, "The people have fled from the battle, and also many of the people have fallen and are dead; and Saul and Jonathan his son are dead also." **5** So David said to the young man who told him, "How do you know that Saul and his son Jonathan are dead?" **6** And the young man who told him said, "By chance I happened to be on Mount Gilboa, and behold, Saul was leaning on his spear. And behold, the chariots and the horsemen pursued him closely. **7** "And when he looked behind him, he saw me and called to me. And I said, 'Here I am.' **8** "And he said to me, 'Who are you?' And I answered him, 'I am an Amalekite.' **9** "Then he said to me, 'Please stand beside me and kill me; for agony has seized me because my life still lingers in me.' **10** "So I stood beside him and killed him, because I knew that he could not live after he had fallen. And I took the crown which was on his head and the bracelet which was on his arm, and I have brought them here to my lord."

2 Samuel 1:11-12 Then David took hold of his clothes and tore them, and so also did all the men who were with him. **12** And they mourned and wept and fasted until evening for Saul and his son Jonathan and for the people of the LORD and the house of Israel, because they had fallen by the sword.

Romans 12:15 Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.

2 Samuel 1:15-16 And David called one of the young men and said, "Go, cut him down." So he struck him and he died. **16** And David said to him, "Your blood is on your head, for your mouth has testified against you, saying, 'I have killed the LORD'S anointed.'"

1 Timothy 5:19 Do not receive an accusation against an elder except on the basis of two or three witnesses.

Matthew 18:15-17 "And if your brother sins, go and reprove him in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother. **16** "But if he does not listen to you, take one or two more with you, so that BY THE MOUTH OF TWO OR THREE WITNESSES EVERY FACT MAY BE CONFIRMED. **17** "And if he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax-gatherer.

Psalms 3:0 A psalm of David. When he fled from his son Absalom.

Psalms 4:0 For the director of music; on stringed instruments. A psalm of David.

Psalms 7:0 A shiggaion of David, which he sang to the LORD concerning Cush, a Benjamite.

Psalms 9:0 For the choir director; on Muth-labben. A Psalm of David.

2 Samuel 23:1-2 Now these are the last words of David. David the son of Jesse declares, And the man who was raised on high declares, The anointed of the God of Jacob, And the sweet psalmist of Israel, **2** “The Spirit of the LORD spoke by me, And His word was on my tongue.

2 Samuel 1:17-18 Then David chanted with this lament over Saul and Jonathan his son, **18** and he told *them* to teach the sons of Judah *the song of the bow*; behold, it is written in the book of Jashar.:

2 Samuel 1:26 “I am distressed for you, my brother Jonathan; You have been very pleasant to me. Your love to me was more wonderful Than the love of women.

1 Samuel 18:3 Then Jonathan made a covenant with David because he loved him as himself.
