

Missionary Update: Nate Eutsey / PNG / Ethnos360

April 10, 2021: When people arrive to PNG they need to quarantine. This past Thursday and Friday were some of my roughest days.

- Three work permit applications needed to be re-submitted.
- I needed to be up at 4:45 am to collect the people returning.
- I needed to get other people to the airport at 6:30 am.
- Prepare the guesthouse flat for people arriving later that morning.
- Update my coworkers on what needed to happen.
- Collect the people who were coming on the flight that was transporting the returnees and then the normal tasks associated with the role. This all took my world into warp speed.

The applications that were lost included documents mailed from Canada which had been thumb-printed by the applicants. Fingerprints and official seals are a very big deal here. Things are often rejected due to stamps missing and unclear prints. I had the couple print color copies, fill out the paperwork, sign and thumbprint it and send it back in an email.

Looking back, I was talking to our pilot and said it is really neat to see God work in situations. The day before I was really stressed and I can honestly say before the Lord that I had a right to be stressed. However, I can also say that the stress I was filling in proportion to the stress I should have allowed myself to carry was far out of whack. The day came and went and thanks to His mercy and grace, everything that needed to happen did

happen. I am praising God for His empowerment and that I am still sane. Thankful to serve a perfect, loving and capable Father. I also thank God for the saints who pray and give to make crazy days like these possible.

²⁷ "Now My soul has become troubled; and what am I to say? 'Father, save Me from this hour'? But for this purpose I came to this hour. 28 Father, glorify Your name."
